"At the Pier" is dedicated to our Founder-Acarya, His Divine Grace A.C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada, who taking the instructions from his spiritual master to heart, at the age of 69, he boarded the cargo ship Jaladutta and came to America, to give us the most precious and everlasting gift, Krishna Consciousness.

In a span of 14 years following his arrival, he travelled around the globe fourteen times, visiting 6 continents and giving countless lectures on Vedic knowledge, giving 1st (Harinam), 2nd (Brahminical), and Sannyasa (Renounced Order) initiations to thousands of people. He founded the Bhaktivedanta Book Trust, and established more than 108 temples, farm communities and Ratha-Yatra festivals before his departure in 1977.



A KIND RESOLUTION

Are we ready to change?

Another year has come to an end and a "New Year" has begun with new resolutions! Or with the same resolutions as we had last year, or the year before, or the year before that. Some people take this time to meditate on the previous year's activities, the plus and the minus, the mistakes and the achievements. But by January 15, most of the resolutions begin to fade away and the deep reflection that we once had on the eve of the new year is now being replaced with worries of the next scheduled holiday, vacation, work or tax season. And then, spring & summer arrive and when we realize it, half year is gone; and we are getting ready for another "holiday season".

So, what happened to our resolution?

ALWAYS REMEMBER KRISHNA NEVER FORGET KRISHNA

Maybe we are not hitting the right one or maybe our will power is not that powerful; maybe it is not a "reachable" goal. It could be a "work-in-progress" and it may take years, and that's ok.

Now, is the resolution on the material platform or on the spiritual one? Which one would be "easier" to accomplish? If we start from the point that material existence is temporary, then it would be more attractive to choose something that may benefit our soul; after all, unlike the material body, the soul is eternal:

"For the soul there is neither birth nor death at any time. He has not come into being, and will not come into being. He is unborn, eternal, ever-existing and primeval. He is not slain when the body is slain" (BG 2.20)

A common quote says: "healthy mind in healthy body", so what happens when we don't have a healthy mind? We may have a healthy body, but if our mind is not under control, then how are we going to control our body, our thoughts, our actions? Above the mind, however, there's intelligence.

In a world where technology and artificial intelligence seems to be taking over human intelligence, it is vital to apply and protect the universal values, to keep the human element alive so that we do not become humanoids and let machines tell us what to do or how to lead and live our lives. No, technology is not bad, it is great, the problem arises when we abuse it. Like anything else,

the problems do not arise from the correct use of

resources, power, etc., it is the abuse or misuse that bring about the problems in the society. And everyone and everything is connected. Let's take a moment to pause and see the real world around us. Maybe we can resolve to be more kind to others -animals & mother nature included-, to be more thankful for what we have, to understand the difference between our desires and our needs, to understand the difference between reality and virtual reality. To be God-loving and not God-fearing.

Sri Caitanya Mahaprabhu instructed in CC Adi 17.31 (Verse 3 Siksastakam):

"One can chant the holy name of the Lord in a humble state of mind, thinking oneself lower than the straw in the street. One should be more tolerant than a tree, devoid of all sense of false prestige and should be ready to offer all respects to others. In such a state of mind one can chant the holy name of the Lord constantly."

Humility, Respect, Tolerance, these 3 values are very nicely highlighted. And if we think about it, we can connect these words to care for or to cause pain.

(HRT = When we apply these values, we could read it as HEART, and a kind heart always cares.

However, if we choose to ignore them, then, we could read them as **HURT**, and this is associated in pain.

Srila Prabhupada writes in his purport of SB 4.6.46:
"The Kṛṣṇa consciousness movement has been started to deliver the envious persons of the world from the clutches of māyā, and even though devotees are sometimes put into trouble, they push on the Kṛṣṇa consciousness movement in all tolerance"

A kind resolution could be:

"ALWAYS REMEMBER KRISHNA, NEVER FORGET KRISHNA". When we remember Krishna, it means that Krishna (God) is present in our heart and mind always; therefore, our thoughts and actions will be in Krishna consciousness. And when we develop love for Krishna, we develop love for all His creation; we connect to a higher path and we'll develop a higher taste.
